Summary of Results

The analysis shows that there are over twice as many out of borough residents who are registered with Havering CCG practices as compared to Havering residents registered with other CCGs (23,395 versus 9,233).

Barking and Dagenham residents form the majority of patients from out of the borough registering with Havering CCG practices (19,083; 82%). Barking and Dagenham CCG houses the majority of Havering residents who are registered with other CCGs (6,597; 72%).


Central Locality Practices possess 71% of all out of borough residents registered with Havering Practices (16,723/23,395); whereas South Locality has the majority of Havering residents who are registered with other CCGs (4,379/9,233) accounting for 47%.

Central Locality also houses the majority of residents (27,827; 31%) and registered patients (19,705; 21%) from other Localities.



Havering residents registered to other CCGs: 9,233 (4%)


Havering CCG registered patients living in other Local Authorities: 23,395 (9%)





Figure 1: Map showing Havering and surrounding Local Authorities where havering CCG registered patients are resident and CCGs that have Havering residents




Figure 2: Map of Havering with Localities and Wards
